APPLYING TO St hilda's college

To study at St Hilda's you must meet the academic entry requirements as well as being exemplary role models for the rest of the school. Please read these carefully before applying and ensure you apply by the deadline of 31st January 2025. Students take either three A-level courses, three BTEC courses, or a combination thereof over two years. Each subject has different entry requirements, but we expect all of our students to have achieved at least five GCSEs at grades 9-4 (or equivalent), including English and Mathematics. Most of our subjects require you to have at least grade 4 or 5 at GCSE. Not all of our subjects require you to have studied it at GCSE, but to study a Modern Foreign Language, DT and Music, you must have done it at GCSE.


For Mathematics and the Sciences, we expect you to have achieved at least grade 7 at GCSE. Every student who wants to apply is given a guidance interview after the GCSE results are published. That way, we can make sure that you study the best subjects that suit your future aspirations. We do our best to ensure that we run every course advertised. It is important to say however, signing up for the course is not a guarantee the course will run.


ACADEMIC MENTORING

One way we can make sure you are on track and achieving in your subjects is academic mentoring with your form tutor.

You will have regular meetings with your form tutor to discuss your progress in all of your subjects, your use of non contact time to do personal study, your time management and organisation.

Academic mentoring also means looking at assessment data and helping you to set targets to ensure you make progress in your subjects.

These meetings are very important because they offer a way of making sure your teachers and the pastoral team can work together to fully support you both inside and outside of the classroom.

All students have the opportunity to attend our Post-18 activities and guidance sessions. This is when we invite universities, employers and our St Hilda's alumni to speak to you about your post 18 options. There is one simple message: set your goals and aspirations high because anything is possible with the right guidance and hard work. Over the course of the year, sessions include:




- UCAS workshops and seminars where you will learn what universities are looking for and how to make your application stand out.
- Advice on writing personal statements, CVs and letters of application.
- Advice and guidance on applying for apprenticeships.
- Applying to Oxford and Cambridge.

- Preparation for the specialist admissions tests such as BMAT and PMAT.
- Visiting universities.
- Confidence and team building with the army.



Students' form tutors and teachers provide ongoing advice about subject and university choice. In addition, our independent and highly experienced careers advisor is available throughout the year to support and navigate students through the employment and apprenticeship opportunities. All of this will help you to feel fully prepared for university/employment and to write outstanding personal statements and letters of application to employers.





PREPARING OUR STUDENTS FOR UNIVERSITY AND GRADUATE CAREERS

HIGH ACHIEVERS PROGRAMME

This specialist programme is aimed at students who have achieved mostly 9-7 grades at GCSE. The programme offers structured support for students who have aspirations to study:

- medicine, dentistry or veterinary science.
- at Oxford or Cambridge.
- at a Russell Group or other prestigious universities.





Being a part of the HAP will both inspire and challenge students. Students will be supported on their journey and offered a variety of opportunities such as admission test workshops, taster lectures delivered by leading academics and university campus visits.

Our students follow HE+ which is a collaborative project between the University of Cambridge and St Hilda's College. The overall goal of the project is to encourage and prepare more academically-able students to make competitive applications to top universities, including the University of Cambridge. We also have long established links with Aspire Liverpool, a high achievers programme designed to raise ambitions and maximise student potential.



During year 12, I was enrolled on the high achievers programme and was lucky to obtain a place on the Aspire programme. We were given the opportunity to attend a 4 day residential at Oxford University, and it was amazing! We all experienced different styles of lessons over the 4 days depending on what 'stream' you were in. I was in the Languages and Literature stream. We also had a scavenger hunt tour of the city, and we were given free time to look around too! It was such a fantastic experience and would totally recommend it! It was a great opportunity to find out what student life would be like in Oxford. As a result of the confidence gained being part of the high achievers programme, this year I have submitted a UCAS application to the University of Oxford!

Tutor the Nation is a charity which matches school and college age learners with university student volunteers to receive free one-to-one tuition. As a link school. St Hilda's can shortlist reliable hard-working students for the service, in a subject of their choice. A year 12 German student said "my speaking is improving a lot as I am now one of the most confident speakers in my class" and "I love the fact that it is student led which means that I can focus on exactly what I want to." A year 13 Psychology student said it "has helped me in achieving As and A*s because I got to target my weaknesses, and it strengthened my passion for my subject beyond the specification."

CORE RE



It is our duty to ensure that all pupils at St Hilda's have Religious Education as a core subject. This is required by the traditions of our college as part of a faith school.

RE is at the heart of our college life and is an essential part of a college students' wider curriculum. It helps them to develop our core vision and values and to become a courageous advocate who can support and be an example to others in the world.

We follow the Liverpool Diocesan programme of study at KS5 to ensure we teach to the curriculum balance of two thirds Christianity and Anglican tradition and one third other principle religions.

The outline of the course content is as follows:

- Should we take care of each other?
- Can social media and surveillance technology help us to flourish?

PARTICIPATION IN THE COMMUNITY

We strongly encourage our students to participate fully in college life and the wider community. Students are given the opportunity to join the Student Leadership Team, the Student Council and become a Student Ambassador. Our student leaders play a role in shaping the life and ethos of the college by representing the views and interests of their peers. Our students help to plan and organise charity events, bake sales and sporting competitions. They also help to plan and deliver assemblies to the whole school: our college students for instance took a leading role in World Mental Health Day and during Black History Month when they delivered assemblies and workshops to students across the school.

Our college students also have the opportunity to contribute to the wider community. They were, for instance selected to take part in an event with the Mayor of Liverpool at the Town Hall which focused on getting people more involved in politics. They had the opportunity to meet the Mayor, local councillors and tour the Town Hall. This was a great opportunity for our students to represent young people's voices from across the city so that our local government leaders were more aware of the issues facing young people in our city.

I'm so proud that I was able to do this, and that the college gave me the confidence to try things like this that will help me in later life. I thank the college for all they have done for me, and I can't wait to share my new adventures with them soon.

An exciting new partnership between St Hilda's College and the Fowler Education and Football Academy (FEFA), starting in September 2025!

In September 25, St Hilda's will partner with FEFA to provide students with the opportunity to study their chosen subjects alongside a high performance, exclusive football training and match programme.

Formed in 2015 by former Liverpool and England player, Robbie Fowler, FEFA are an award-winning post 16 education provider that have built a local, national, and international recognition of excellence.

Based at Liverpool FC's Melwood Sports Complex, students can study:

- Sports Coaching BTEC (single, double, and triple awards).
- Sports Science BTEC (single, double, and triple awards). FEFA are the only provider in Liverpool of this course.
- Health BTEC (in partnership with Alder Hey Children's NHS Foundation Trust).
- A-Levels in Maths and English (taught onsite at Melwood).

On the pitch... FEFA has:

- Won two National Cups and the National Football Youth League Title (2021, 2024).
- Won two international football tournaments in Florida (2024).
- Won the English Colleges National Football Championship (2018).
- Supported students to achieve professional and semiprofessional football contracts.
